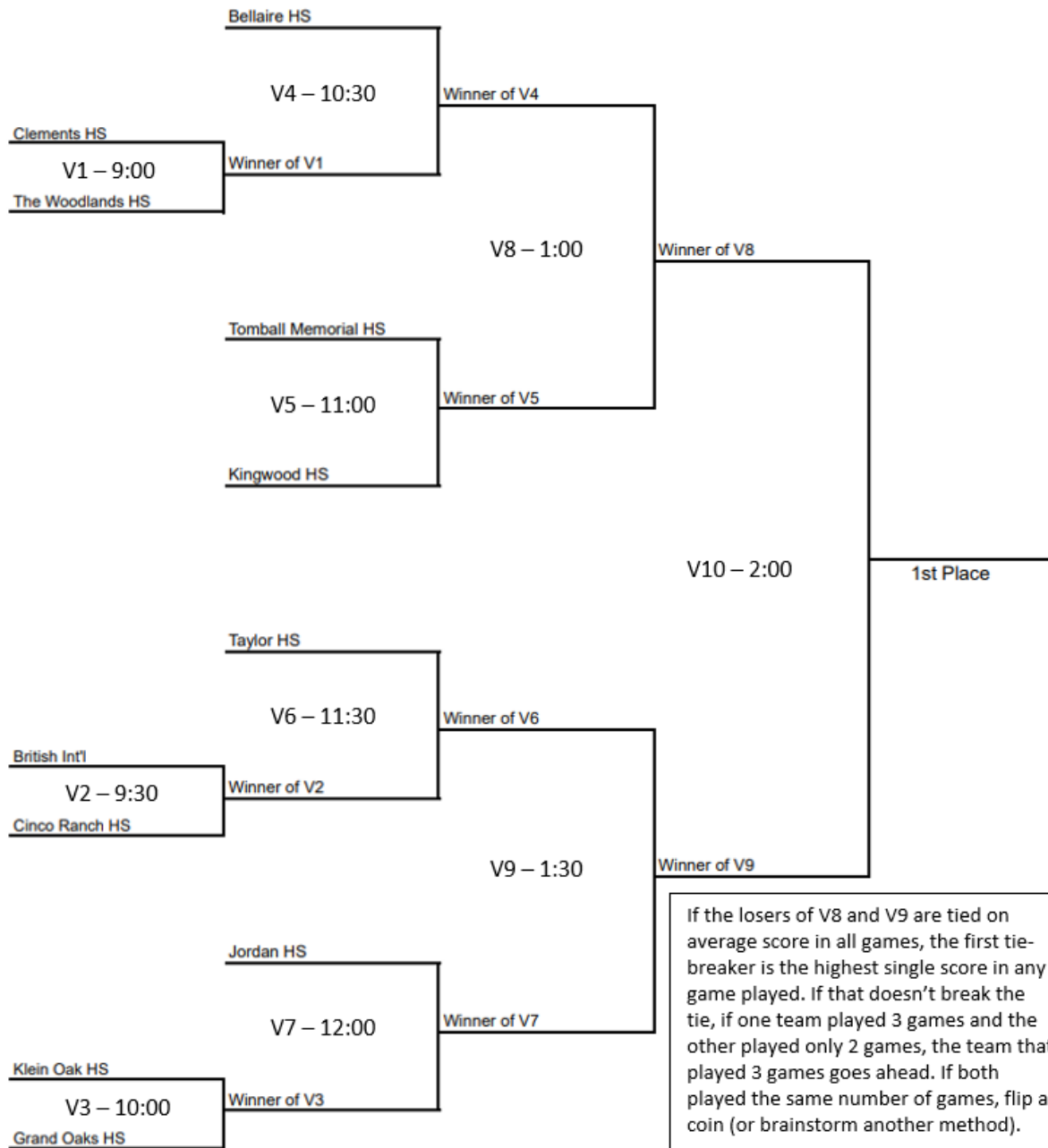


Varsity Pass auf! - Houstonfest 2025



If the losers of V8 and V9 are tied on average score in all games, the first tie-breaker is the highest single score in any game played. If that doesn't break the tie, if one team played 3 games and the other played only 2 games, the team that played 3 games goes ahead. If both played the same number of games, flip a coin (or brainstorm another method).

Varsity Game 1 (V1), **9:00: Clements vs. The Woodlands**

- Winner plays at 10:30.
- Loser is eliminated.

Varsity Game 2 (V2), **9:30: British Int'l vs. Cinco Ranch**

- Winner plays at 11:30.
- Loser is eliminated.

Varsity Game 3 (V3), **10:00: Klein Oak vs. Grand Oaks**

- Winner plays at 12:00.
- Loser is eliminated.

Varsity Game 4 (V4), **10:30: Bellaire vs. Winner V1**

- Winner plays at 1:00.
- Loser is eliminated.

Varsity Game 5 (V5), **11:00: Tomball Memorial vs. Kingwood**

- Winner plays at 1:00.
- Loser is eliminated.

Varsity Game 6 (V6), **11:30: Taylor vs. Winner V2**

- Winner plays at 1:30.
- Loser is eliminated.

Varsity Game 7 (V7), **12:00: Jordan vs. Winner V3**

- Winner plays at 1:30.
- Loser is eliminated.

Varsity Game 8 (V8), **1:00: Winner V4 vs. Winner V5**

- Winner plays at 2:00.
- Loser is eliminated (3rd or 4th place).

Varsity Game 9 (V9), **1:30: Winner V6 vs. Winner V7**

- Winner plays at 2:00.
- Loser is eliminated (3rd or 4th place).

Varsity Game 10 (V10), **2:00: Winner V8 vs. Winner V9**

- Winner is 1st place; loser is 2nd place.

For 3rd and 4th, between the losers of V8 and V9, the team with the higher average score in all their games played (which could be 2 or 3 games) is 3rd, and the other team is 4th. See box to the left if tied.
